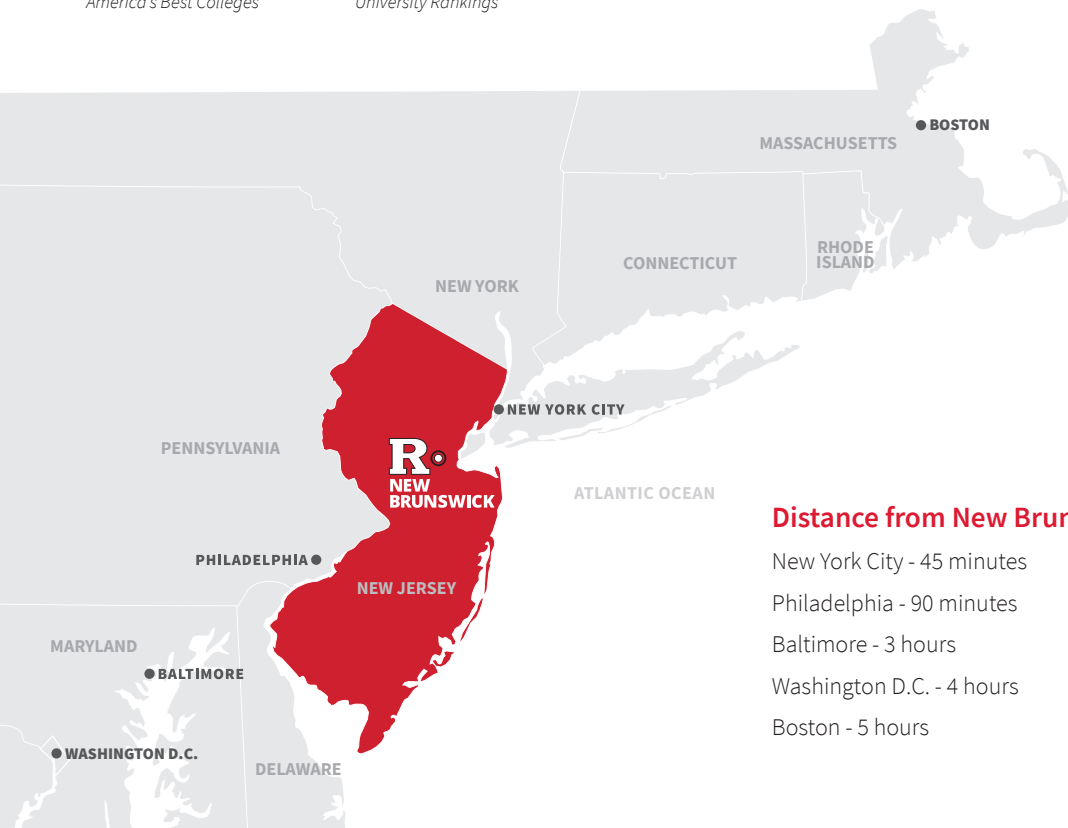

Pathways to Success:

- The Rutgers Internship & Co-op Program kick-starts students' careers as they earn **real-world experience** and **class credit** at the same time.
- Median starting salary for graduates is **\$60K with an 80% placement rate** within six months of graduation.
- Rutgers provides one of the **largest and most comprehensive** university career services operations in the nation with at least 50 workshops hosted each semester.
- **One-on-one career counseling** is offered to assess skills and interests.

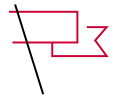

- Submit the Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR)
first-year students only
- Send official SAT or ACT test scores
first-year students only, SAT and ACT scores are now optional for 2021 applicants
- Submit official transcripts from all colleges attended
transfers students only
- Pay \$70 application fee
