- Complete a Rutgers or Coalition Application
- Submit the Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR) first-year students only
- Send official SAT or ACT test scores first-year students only, SAT and ACT scores are now optional for 2021 applicants
- Submit official transcripts from all colleges attended transfers students only
- Pay \$70 application fee
