First-year Admission Guidelines

Our Promise – A Comprehensive Review

The admissions team at the University of Arizona realizes that personal excellence can and should be evaluated by more than just academic achievement. Through our Comprehensive Review process, we are expanding access to students who will bring unique life experiences and personal achievements to our campus community.

Admission and scholarship award decisions are driven by comprehensive review. Every application may be reviewed by up to two different reviewers before a final decision is made. This process allows us to consider more than a student's academic profile. Factors such as class rank, strength of curriculum, performance in curriculum and grade point average in required core academic courses will be considered. Other factors may include leadership, service, work experience and extracurricular activities; personal characteristics, attributes, and talents; and the ability to benefit from and contribute to a diverse and challenging learning environment. We are interested in learning more about the student's preparedness, motivation, and potential in the unique context of their experience. Applicants will have the opportunity to include a brief statement to share any discrepancies in their academic record or any additional information they would like to include. Through this process, we are making more comprehensive and individualized admission and scholarship decisions.

In recognition of the high level of academic aptitude and course work competency demonstrated by many students who seek admission to UA, we also offer Assured Admission. Students may earn admission to UA through the Assured Admission process if they attend a regionally accredited high school, rank in the top 25 percent of their graduating class, and have no course work deficiencies as prescribed by the Arizona Board of Regents or earn an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher in their core coursework. Applicants who do not meet the Assured Admission criteria are still considered for admission through comprehensive review.

Students who take the General Education Development Test (GED) must submit official test scores and meet the minimum requirements to be considered for admission. Students who took the Fourth Test Series between 2001-2013 must earn an average of

500. Students who took the Fifth Test Series beginning 2014 to present must earn an average of 680 AND each content module requires a minimum score of 170.

Home-schooled students will be considered on the basis of portfolio/course work and comprehensive review.

Notes

Some programs or colleges may require additional application information and/or admission requirements. If students apply to those programs and do not meet the additional qualifications, they will be considered for admission in another program for which they may qualify. For a complete program listing, please visit degreesearch.arizona.edu. Estimating the likelihood of admission is very difficult without considering the complete application file. Thus, it is crucial for applicants to carefully complete the process by providing timely, comprehensive and accurate information.

A separate application is required to enroll in the SALT Center. The SALT Center provides individualized academic support by offering a comprehensive range of services for students with learning and attention differences. There are additional fees to use SALT Center services. You must apply to both the University and to the SALT Center in order to be considered for admission to the SALT Center. Due to the high demand of these services, it is also recommended that you submit your application to the SALT Center at the same time or very soon after submitting the UA application. A separate application is also required to enroll in the Honors College. The University of Arizona Honors College is home to bright, motivated students who want to take advantage of everything the UA has to offer while also having the support of a small, diverse community of scholars. Transfer Admission Requirements

You will be considered for transfer student admission if you meet the following criteria at the time of application:

- ▶ 24 or more transferable college semester credits post-high school
- ▶ A recalculated cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher
- ▶ Fulfilled the course competencies by the Arizona Board of Regents

OR

- ▶ 12-23 transferable post-high school college semester credits completed or in progress
- ▶ A recalculated cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher
- ▶ 2.0 cumulative high school GPA
- ▶ Fulfilled the course competencies by the Arizona Board of Regents

NOTE: Arizona Board of Regents Course Competencies are waived if you are 22 years of age or older in both situations.

Arizona residents will be admitted with one of the following:

- ▶ Successful completion of the Arizona General Education Curriculum, AGECE, and a minimum recalculated cumulative GPA of 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale).

Admission decisions will be released the semester before you intend to enroll once your application is complete. For example, if you apply for fall 2021, a decision will be made in spring 2021.



This application packet is for First-year and transfer applicants to the University of Arizona (Tucson Main Campus or other Arizona location) who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents. If you are applying for readmission to UA, or as a non-degree-seeking student, or as an international student, this is not the correct application for you. Please go to arizona.edu/future-students to apply using the appropriate application.

First-year Application Checklist:

A complete application for a First-year applicant MUST include:

- Completed online or paper application

 - ▶ An official final (8-semester, with graduation date) high school transcript must be submitted before you enroll. Self-reported grades will be used for the initial evaluation and review for an admission decision. Please do not send us your official transcripts at this time. More information will be provided upon admission.
- Application Processing Fee
 - ▶ Tucson Main Campus - \$50 (Arizona Resident), \$80 (Non-Resident) or an eligible fee waiver.
 - ▶ Arizona Distance locations - \$50 (Resident and Non-Resident)
 - ▶ This fee is nonrefundable and nontransferable.

If you are home-schooled, provide a transcript or portfolio of course work

If you have earned a GED certificate, provide official GED test results.

Apply for admission and financial aid as early as possible during your senior year of high school. Applications submitted or completed after the deadline may not be considered. Apply for housing, orientation, and summer programs immediately after admission. Your future housing assignment will be based on your housing application date and other factors, not on your UA admission date.

- Completed online or paper application
- Official transcript(s)
 - ▶ Official transcripts from all college and universities attended, even if credit was not established, must be submitted directly from those institutions. If name changes have occurred ensure that your current name is included on all transcripts.
 - ▶ An official high school transcript, home school transcripts or GED must be submitted if you are under age 22 or if you have less than 24 transferable college credits complete at the time you apply.
- Application Processing Fee
 - ▶ Tucson Main Campus - \$50 (Arizona Resident), \$80 (Non-Resident) or an eligible fee waiver.
 - ▶ Arizona Distance locations - \$50 (Resident and Non-Resident)
 - ▶ This fee is nonrefundable and nontransferable.

Apply one semester before you intend to enroll. Applications submitted or completed after the deadline may not be considered. Application deadlines for specific majors may be earlier. Admitted First-year engineering students will be identified as Engineering, No Major Selected. Major selection (non-competitive) typically occurs during the first year after completion of introductory coursework. TRANSFER: Transfer applicants apply directly to their major of choice. The following are considered during review:

- completion of Calculus I (required, C or better)
- cumulative and major-related GPA*
- recency of coursework

General instructions

- Read the application instructions and information carefully.
- Apply early. We start reviewing an application as soon as we receive all required materials. The earlier you submit your complete application, the earlier you will receive a decision. Applications cannot be reviewed until they are complete.
- Submit the application processing fee. This fee is nonrefundable and nontransferable. Applications are valid for one term only. Fee payment options include check, money order, credit card, or eligible fee waiver. If you plan to pay the application fee by credit card, it is best to apply online. Meet with your high school admissions counselor if you believe you qualify for an application fee waiver.
- If you choose to apply using a paper application, submit the application and additional required materials. Remember to sign your application and keep a copy of all documents for your records. Be sure to complete the entire application, if you leave any information blank it will delay the processing of your application.
- First-year applicants will be asked to provide self-reported grades in the 16 ABOR (Arizona Board of Regents) high school course work



competencies. These self-reported grades will be used for initial evaluation and review for an admission decision.

- If you feel that your academic performance in high school or college was adversely affected by special circumstances, summarize the information on the additional information sheet provided (include dates where applicable).
- This application is for First-year and transfer applicants who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents. International students

(non-immigrants) should call 520.621.7524 or visit admissions.arizona.edu/how-to-apply/international

- The University of Arizona has locations around the state, serving Arizona communities as part of the University's land grant mission. These statewide locations offer upper-division courses and programs for transfer students to complete a Bachelor's degree close to home! Questions you might ask

1. Will I be considered for admission?
Yes. We review every complete application, provided all required documents/materials are submitted by the appropriate deadline. Please visit admissions.arizona.edu or call 520.621.3237 for more details.

2. What are the different ways I can apply?

As an undergraduate degree-seeking applicant, there are two ways you can apply for admission. The preferred method for you to apply is online by visiting <https://slate.admissions.arizona.edu/apply/>. (The main advantages of applying online include immediate submission, electronic acknowledgement, and the potential for faster processing.) You may also choose to download the application, print out the appropriate PDF version, complete and submit that form of application.

3. Can I submit my high school transcript(s) before I apply?

High school transcripts are not required for the initial evaluation and review for an admission decision. Applicants are asked to provide self-reported grades. If you are admitted and decide to enroll at the University of Arizona, you will be required to submit a final, official high school transcript after graduation. Official high school transcripts will be used to confirm all self-reported coursework and grades were reported accurately prior to enrollment at the University of Arizona. If you provide false information for the purpose of GPA or course improvement it may invalidate further consideration for admissions or result in rescinding of the offer for admission and scholarships.

4. Why do you ask for my Social Security number?

We use your Social Security number to confirm and match documents associated with your application. You also must provide your Social Security number in order to be considered for financial aid grants, loans and/or on-campus employment.

5. I am a First-year applicant. What are the main factors you will consider in the comprehensive review of my application file?

We consider the academic and non-academic elements of your application. In the area of academic profile, we look at the strength of your curriculum, your performance in the curriculum, and your academic aptitude or achievement as demonstrated by scores on standardized tests. In the non-academic aspects of your application, we look at your activities summary and your unique life experiences, attributes, achievements and talents and additional information shared in your responses. You will have an opportunity to submit an optional statement if you would like to share additional information for the admissions office to consider.

6. If my high school does not rank, can I still be considered for admission?

Absolutely. We consider much more than the traditional measures of past and projected performance and promise. The absence of class rank will not be a disadvantage to a prepared and motivated student.

7. Do I need to have a certain test score in order to be considered for admission?

SAT/ACT scores are not required for general admission to the University, merit scholarship eligibility, or admission to our more selective programs such as the Honors College. If a student chooses to submit official SAT/ACT scores, they may be used to assist with class placement at orientation or to help fulfill Arizona Board of Regents (ABOR) course competencies.

8. How many college units do I need to have completed in order to be considered a transfer applicant?

In order to be considered for admission as a transfer applicant, you must have completed a minimum of 12 transferable college semester credits/units after high school by the time you apply and be a high school graduate (or equivalent). For more details see Transfer Admission Requirements on page 2.

9. Can I submit additional materials such as letters of recommendation?

Any non-required materials will not be considered or retained. Therefore, we recommend that you do not submit any additional materials other than what is requested on the application. If you are applying to the Honors College, one letter of recommendation is required. You will be asked to provide your recommender's contact information within the Honor's application.

10. What are the average academic profiles of last year's entering First-year classes?

The First-year entering the UA in the fall of 2019 and enrolling full-time had an unweighted mean GPA of 3.51 a mean combined SAT critical reading and math: 1262, and a mean ACT composite of 26.

11. Am I an Arizona Resident?

If you are not certain about your residency, we encourage you to call the UA Residency Classification Office at 520.621.3636. You may also visit their Web site at www.registrar.arizona.edu/residency/general-residency-guidelines. (Remember, if you will be submitting an eligible application processing fee waiver, you will not need to determine which fee we will waive.) If you plan to submit a fee waiver do not submit a payment with your application. We will not be able to refund the application fee even if we receive a fee waiver after you have paid.



12. When will I be notified about my admission decision?

Once we have your complete application, including all required additional materials, it usually takes 2-4 weeks for application processing and review to be completed and for your notification to be sent. 14. How do I satisfy the academic course work requirements or , competencies as a First-year or a transfer applicant?

All First-year applicants and all transfer applicants under age 22 are expected to satisfactorily complete the Arizona Board of Regents' course work competencies as identified in the table below. See the table below for the course work competency requirements and for specific scores and/or courses needed. To make up any course work deficiencies with transferable

college courses, see table below, right-hand column. If you have met a subject area in high school, you do not need to satisfy college course work requirements in that area for admission purposes.
