- Aptitude tests: Some institutions by checking your documents decide whether or not you are eligible for the study course. Other institutions may have additional evaluations in the form of tests or interviews
- Language skills: For a Master's degree in the German language you need to have knowledge of the German language equaling level C1 as described by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (eg: DSH-2 or TestDaF TDN 4).
 For a Master's degree offered in English you need to provide a certificate stating your lingual ability of at least level B2 as described by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (ex: TOEFL iBT 80 or IELTS 6.5)
- (2) If you possess a 4 year Bachelor's degree you are eligible to apply for a Master's degree program with following requirements:
- Aptitude tests: Some institutions by checking your documents decide whether or not you are eligible for the study course. Other institutions may have additional evaluations in the form of tests or interviews
- Language skills: For a Master's degree in the German language you need to have knowledge of the German language equaling level C1 as described by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (eg: DSH-2 or TestDaF TDN 4).
 For a Master's degree offered in English you need to provide a certificate stating your lingual ability of at least level B2 as described by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (ex: TOEFL iBT 80 or IELTS 6.5)

Your application with the International Centre is usually done via the University Application Service for International Students: uni-assist e.V. However for some Master's programs you can apply directly to the respective institute. For more information please visit the website of the institute offering the study course you would like to apply for.

Parallel to submitting your application for a Master's program, you usually must also register for the aptitude test at the respective institute. For further details please visit the following website: www.uni-leipzig.de/en/international/master.

Additional Admission Requirements

- In addition to the above mentioned requirements, for courses which
 are in high demand, there exist further admission restrictions. For
 such courses only a limited number of places of study are available
 and the allocation of these places depend on the academic grades
 of the applicant and is decided via a selection process at the
 University of Leipzig.
- Some study courses require certain foreign language skills or professional experience. Details can be found in the respective program regulations.

Recognition of Academic Achievements:

There is a possibility that already acquired academic achievements from Indian Universities are acknowledged at the University of Leipzig. It however depends on the individual exam offices of particular Faculties you are applying to. It is highly recommended that you communicate and clarify which of your achievements can be acknowledged prior to the application process.

For PhD Study

PhD can be done in all subjects that are offered at the University of Leipzig. Admission as a PhD candidate to the appropriate Faculty is subject to the Doctoral Regulations of the University Faculties. The University of Leipzig offers international students two different ways to earn a doctorate: either individually or within a structured program. In both cases you'll first need a written confirmation from your future advising professor before applying for admission through the International Centre.

In a structured program you'll earn a doctorate working within a Graduate Centre. You'll have a set time frame to earn your doctorate, a clearly defined curriculum and individual support from academic advisors.

Within an individual PhD program you'll work closely with an advising professor (often referred to as your "Doktormutter" or "Doktorvater" in German) to write your dissertation. You earn your PhD at a Faculty of the University on a dissertation topic of your choice.

The University of Leipzig also offers a bi-national doctorate using the




Affordability and Financial Aid

with the exception of few Master's programs the undergraduate studies at the University of Leipzig is free of charge. As a student one should expect a monthly expense of around 650 Euros. Degrees

Since the academic year 2006/2007 the University of Leipzig offers courses with Bachelor's and Master's degree in Natural Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences. Future Lawyers, Doctors, Pharmacists take up a so called State Examinations. A Diploma can be completed in three different academic courses (Protestant Theology, Mathematics and Business Mathematics).

As part of a far reaching reform of the education system at the University level, academic programs are designed on a three tier system: Bachelor, Master and PhD. Thus, a three year program leads to the first academic and professional degree: the Bachelor. Based on the Bachelor's degree follows a two year Master's program with an opportunity to specialize. Afterwards there is the possibility for doctoral study (PhD). Depending on the study course the following degrees are offered at the University of Leipzig:



Application Process and Admission Requirements

The admission requirements and application process depend on the type of degree you want to obtain at the University of Leipzig. From the course database available at the University's webpage: www.zv.uni-leipzig.de/en/study/study-opportunities/study-programmes.html, it is evident:

- What courses are offered along with their corresponding degrees.
- What specific knowledge and language requirements must be met.
- Whether an aptitude test is required or not.
- Whether there are any admission restrictions.

For Undergraduate Degree (Bachelor, State Examination or Diploma)

(1) If you want to study in Leipzig immediately after completing your secondary school/college (12 years of education) then, before commencing your chosen study course, you must attend the so called 'Studienkolleg Sachsen' (Saxony Preparatory Course) for two semesters at the University of Leipzig. The Studienkolleg basically offers subject specific knowledge to help you prepare for an assessment test which entitles you to study at the University of Leipzig.

You must have an aggregate of at least 50% or more in your secondary school leaving certificate (12 years of school education) in order to begin your study in Leipzig. An additional requirement to participate in the Studienkolleg Leipzig is that you must possess German language skills equaling level B1 as described by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (about 500 hours of German).

(2) In order to study at the University of Leipzig without attending the Studienkolleg (Saxony Preparatory Course), after secondary education (12 years of education) Indian applicants must have successfully completed one year of university study at a state-recognized university in India.

As a prerequisite you must have an aggregate of at least 50% or more in your secondary school leaving certificate (12 years of school education). After having successfully completed one year of university study in India, you can enter the University of Leipzig in the first semester of undergraduate program (Bachelor, Diploma or State Examination). In this case, the field in which you were registered at the Indian University must be maintained at the University of Leipzia.

You must possess German language skills equaling level C1 as described by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (eg: DSH-2 or TestDaF TDN 4).

(3) After completing 12 years of education (school/college) and having successfully passed the Joint Entrance Exam at one of the Indian Institutes of Technology you are eligible to start directly at the University of Leipzig in the same field of study as in India. In this case there are no minimum aggregate requirements in your secondary school education certificate. The university study in Leipzig requires students to have knowledge of the German language equaling level C1 as described by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (eg: DSH-2 or TestDaF TDN 4).

(4) If you have completed a 4 year Bachelor's Degree, you have the possibility to study at the University of Leipzig directly. In this case you have the possibility to apply for another undergraduate degree in a different field of study/specialization:

(If you have completed a 3 year Bachelor's degree you have the opportunity to study directly at the University of Leipzig maintaining the field of Bachelor study in India).

The University study in Leipzig requires students to have knowledge of the German language equaling level C1 as described by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (eg: DSH-2 or TestDaF TDN 4).

For Graduate Degree (Master)

(1) If you possess a 3 year Bachelor's degree you are eligible to apply for a Master's degree program if you fulfill the following requirements:

 Minimum grade: First division/class 60% and above or A = Very Good and above or a GPA from 3.00 onwards.
